### 4. First-aid measures

<b>Inhalation</b>	IF INHALED: Remove person to fresh air and keep comfortable for breathing. Immediately call a POISON CENTER/doctor.

### 5. Fire-fighting measures

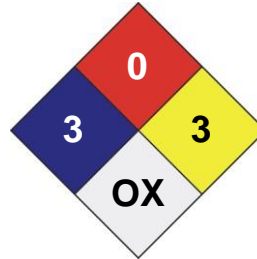
